COMMUNITY NEWS: AUGUST 2023

A heartfelt thank you must go to our August seminar guest speaker Mr Leo Lee. Leo is the current president of Safe Our Waterways Now (SOWN), the groundbreaking and leading bushcare organisation in The Gap.

Leo is exceptionally knowledgeable about the local creek fauna and flora, and presented data about Enoggera creek salinity, oxygenation, temperature, and Ph. He explained that Enoggera Creek is home to many invertebrate and fish species, but due to a wide range of factors, their number and the diversity of species are in decline. These include issues such as pollution, habitat destruction, feral animals and plants, and imported diseases just to name a few.

However, Leo also was hopeful given the success of SOWN and the planting that has been undertaken over the past 30 years that things can still be turned around. One positive sign is the reemergence of Rakali – a native water rat which is again been seen along Enoggera Creek. With regards to our Platypus project, Leo recommended that the health of the creek and the available food source for the Platypus need to be much better before they can return.

A focus of our work must be the education of the community on the many ways they can support the regeneration of the creeks, besides planting, this includes reducing the use of fertiliser, herbicides and pesticides, and being very mindful about any chemicals or toxic substances that could reach the creeks through the stormwater drains. This is particularly important during times of drought when the water is stagnant.

Leo discussed the pros and cons of water releases from the dam, highlighting that this may be potentially detrimental especially if the water comes from the bottom of the dam, where it is very cold and lack oxygen.

Thank you once again Leo for an insightful presentation.


