COMMUNITY NEWS: OCTOBER 2023

October turned out to be a very busy month for us.

Out of the numerous volunteer organisations in Australia, **we were chosen** as one of only two in Queensland and one of just ten across the country for **mentoring by the Rewiring Australia team**.. Genevieve, Mark, Michael, and Monika attended the first group meeting. It was fascinating to hear about the diversity of activities that groups in different states are embarking on. There are now discussions about a great variety of topics and we learned that there was a recent senate enquiry about electrifying households which has **many submissions** that are worthwhile reading about.

We welcomed <u>Dr Gilad Bino</u>, from the UNSW, as our seminar speaker on the 17th October. Gilad is an ecologist with extensive experience in Platypus research. Gilad shared with us the five-step plan that was followed to re-introduce Platypus successfully into Royal National Park in NSW. Partnerships (e.g., with WWF and Taronga Zoo), community engagement, and scientific knowledge were all critical to make sure the habitat was suitable and the Platypus would thrive.

Also on the 17th October, we attended a large stakeholder meeting about protecting platypus in SEQ and bringing it back to The Gap, and the Enoggera Creek health. Representatives from government and non-government organisations, RSPCA, Watergum, Brisbane City Council, wildlife carers and scientists came together to assess the current evidence surrounding Platypus sightings in Enoggera Creek, hear from currently ongoing initiatives and share strategic plans, and discuss how to best move forward in a logical and clear order to make Enoggera Creek habitable again. Leo Lee, SWON president, our guest speaker in August, has made it clear that one of the most pressing issues we need to address first is to restore the food chain from aquatic plants to microorganisms and macroinvertebrates to have any chance of Platypuses finding the environment habitable. It will take all parts of the community to work together to achieve our aim, and the meeting that was hosted by the Walkabout Creek Discovery Centre, Queensland Parks and Wildlife Services and Partnerships, Department of Environment and Science was a first and very important step. Thank you to all involved.

On the 19th October, some members, high school students and the wider community were fortunate to have **the Brisbane** Climate Fresk volunteer team guide us through the game at The Gap State High School. This game is an eyeopener and highlights just how interrelated all components of the climate are and the complexity of the system. There were many standout moments during the night, but most rewarding was to see the students from The Gap High School participating and coming up with solutions for future generations. Thank you to Rex Betrand Science Reacher and a/Deputy Principal for encouraging the students to attend and The High School for hosting the event.

As we celebrate numerous achievements and progress in all our projects, we would greatly appreciate it if any of our members could step-up to help advance one or more of these activities.. For example, for the Platypus projectis looking for volunteers to help map the creek (where are waterholes, how deep are they, how does it change over the year), organise macroinvertebrate surveys, possibly in collaboration with the local schools, and help organise community events.
