COMMUNITY NEWS: SEPTEMBER 2023

Thank you to Payne Road State School for allowing us to use the Library for our September working Group Meeting. We had a great update from each working group and a number of new discussion points were raised.

1) Enhancing existing opportunities: The verge garden project was presented to Councillor Steve Toomey, who is now discussing it with the relevant officers in Brisbane City Council. Regardless of the outcome, we have a good plan now on how we can start to engage more people in requesting street trees. This initiative is also important for the Platypus project. Given the lack of water in Enoggera creek even shortly after rain, the Platypus team identified the need for a focus on restoring the watercycle. Verge gardens and street trees can help to retain rain water in gardens for longer so that run off is less rapid, and and water flows to the creeks more slowly and for longer.

2) Energy Group: We applied to be a community partner for Rewiring Australia, as an exemplar suburb and are very happy to announce that *we have been selected* as one of only two Queensland sites for <u>mentoring by the Rewiring team</u>. We are in contact with Energex as they progress the installation of the Federal Government awarded community battery in The Gap. We work towards having a community meeting at The Gap, where the roll out of the battery and the potential benefits for the community members can be discussed. TGSI wants to become the community who would like to use a community battery in the future to reduce their Energy bill. In the meantime, Mark Crocker kindly offered to photograph and interview Low Emissions Households in The Gap, so that they could be featured in blogs on our website, allowing to inspire others to undertake similar action. 3) Platypus Group: We are thrilled to announce that <u>Dr Gilad Bino</u> will be our next seminar guest speaker on the 17th October. Gilad is a leading Platypus researcher and was involved in the recent rewilding of Platypus at the Royal National Park near Sydney. The Platypus Group has made great progress in formulating a project plan and identifying critical issues that need to be addressed for the habitat of the Platypus. They are now looking for volunteers who would undertake a SOWN/WaterBug Blitz; help with a project to monitor the Creek using eDNA surveys possibly in collaboration with the local schools; coordinate efforts to improve the aquatic plants and animals variety in the creek; produce a map of the creek at different times of the year so that continuous waterholes can be identified.
